Genetic Factors:

⇒ Genetics is also a problem of causing schizophrenia it mainly involves the siblings, family members and relative

⇒ Twins are most commonly affected mainly the identical twins are mainly affected by this condition such as 50% rather than a non identical.

Biological Factors:

Neurotransmitter chemicals:

Dopamine DA

- * Some neurotransmitters play a vital role in the mental and mood behaviours
- * Dopamine is the chemical receptor which will causes the depression
- * If the dopamine increases the neurotransmitter the too much of messages to the brain. the brain create the state of confusing.
- * Dopamine inducing substance intake also increase the level of dopamine such as cocaine, marijuana etc.

Serotonin

- * Serotonin play a role of controlling the level of dopamine
- * There is a believe in too much of serotonin is the reason of depression and mania

Neuroanatomical Structure!

* These are reason too when the Neuroanatomic are changed to cause the Mental disorders especially the Schizophrenia.

- ⇒ Large Ventricles
- ⇒ Impaired or diminished blood flow to the brain
- ⇒ Low brain weight

Immunovirology!

* Virus also the one of the reason of causing the Schizophrenia.

* In Maternal period when the mother affected any viral infection will affect the brain and nervous system of fetus.

Psychological Factors!

- ⇒ insight.

General Appearance.

In General Appearance we should assess the Appearance, Hygiene, Gesturing, Rapport, Hallucinatory behaviours, mode of entry, Obedience, catatonic behaviours,

Speech and thought

In speech we should assess the tone, volume, rhythm, pitch, reactive time, imitation others echolalia, form of thought, stream of thought
mood and affect

In mood we assess the predominant mood through the asking questions like How do you feel now? etc.

Perception:

→ Perception is the expression of how the individual perceives the stimuli

→ In this there is illusion, Hallucination, delusion, déjà vu, Jamavu, derealization, depersonalization

Cognitive functioning

Assessing the consciousness, orientation, intellectual thinking, Attention, Arithmetic thinking, Abstract thinking

a) Calculate the percentage of burns.

Burns

Burns is a form of traumatic injury caused by thermal, electrical, chemical or radioactive agents. In other words, direct exposure to heat that may result burns. Severity & depth is depending according to the exposure of burns. It is otherwise called coagulative necrosis of the body tissue.

According to rule of nine.

- Head & neck - 9
- Chest front - 18
- back - 18
- Right arm - 9
- Left arm - 9

Genitalia - 1

Lower extremities - 18

Buttock - 9

Percentage of burns = 54% (Rule of nine)

Causes of burns.

- * Thermal burns.
- * Electrical burns.
- * Chemical burns
- * Radiation.
- * Direct exposure to hot substance.

Types of burns.

↳ Thermal burn injury

↳ Dry heat

↳ flame burns;

↳ Scald.

Classification of burns.

- * According to depth of burn injury
- * According to burn size extent.

i) Depth of burn injury.

1) ✓ First degree burns (superficial burns)

✓ It involves: epidermis layer.

✓ 3-6 days to heal.

Sign and symptoms.

* Pain

* Redness

* Blanching

* Dryness (& There is no scar formation)

2) Second degree burns.

i) Superficial partial thickness.

✓ It involve epidermis & dermis layers.

✓ 7-14 days to heal.

Sign & symptoms.

* Pain

* Moist

* Blister

* redness.

* Dryness.

* Blanching. (Scar formation present)

* Secondary open angle glaucoma.

* Secondary angle closure glaucoma.

2. Complication of conjunctivitis.

✓ Blurred vision.

✓ Vision loss.

✓ Visual Impairment.

✓ Keratitis.

✓ Trachoma.

✓ Burning sensation of the eye.

✓ Edematous of the eye.

✓ Chalazion.

3. Contracture.

It is one of the complication of burn injury. In contracture, the skin seen in black colour, muscle stiffness b/w the joint can't move, flex the joints.

4. Prevention of cervical cancer.

✓ By using contraceptives while sexual intercourse.

✓ Avoid multiple sexual partners.

✓ To take pap smear for determine cervical cancer.

✓ Advice the reproductive age women to attend Integrated counselling and testing center.

✓ Avoid sex with HIV partners.

5. Define glasgow coma scale.

Glasgow comascale is used to assess the pain level & evaluate the behavioural response of the patient.

In glasgow coma scale

- ✓ Verbal response.
 - ✓ Eye response and
 - ✓ motor response are checked and assessed.

6. Indication of hysterectomy.

- * Irregular menses.
- * Pelvic inflammatory disease
- * Endometriosis.
- * Menorrhagia.
- * Uterine prolapse.
- * Uterine fibroids.
- * Polycystic ovarian syndrome.
- * Uterine cancer.

7. First Aid scene of burns.
- ✓ Fluid replacement therapy.
 - ✓ Clean the wound by cold running water.
 - ✓ Apply the pressure over the wounds.
 - ✓ Cold compression.
 - ✓ Provide analgesics.
 - ✓ Remove the cloth where the burn occur.
 - ✓ Provide adequate ventilation.

8. Hemiplegia.

Hemiplegia is a condition, it is characterized by paralysis of the one side of the body due to lack of O₂ & ischemia and necrosis of the brain tissue.
