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2.5.3 Reforms in the process and procedure in the conduct of evaluation/examination; including the automation of the examination system

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2.5.3 Consolidated report on information on examination reforms:

Over the past five years, the university has overhauled its examination and evaluation processes. Internal assessment and attendance records for each subject are now submitted via the university's onlin portal. Students can view examination fees for each subject on the institution's portal and are required to make payments via NEFT/RTGS before the specified deadline as per university guidelines. One submitted online, this information is forwarded to the university, after which hall tickets are generated and distributed to students following verification by the Principal. Additionally, the exam timetable is now readily accessible for students, displayed prominently on the college notice board.

As per the university's directives, CCTV cameras, metal detectors, and mobile jammers have bee installed in the examination hall. Students are thoroughly briefed on examination regulations and th consequences of any misconduct. The process of accessing question papers is fully automated: the chic superintendent must log in to the university website portal using a designated ID and password 15 minute before the exam begins, and then photocopies are made as needed. Additionally, examination hall CCT cameras and cellphone jammers are activated 30 minutes prior to the start of the examination.

The chief superintendent and invigilator are responsible for documenting all activities in the examination hall from 30 minutes before the start of the exam until the completion of packing and sealing the answer book bundle. This entire examination process is meticulously recorded onto a CD, which is then promptly dispatched to the university on the same day, along with the answer book bundle. Since 2018, on-screen evaluation of answer papers has been conducted at the evaluation center located in The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai.

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


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Examination hall CCTV cameras and cellphone jammers

22. MARKS QUALIFYING FOR PASS:

- 50% of marks in the University Theory Examinations.
- 50% of marks in the University Practical Examinations.
- 50% of marks in the subject where internal evaluation alone is conducted at the institution level.
- 50% of marks in aggregate in Theory, Practical and internal assessment marks taken together.
- 50% of marks in each Section A& B separately where two subjects are combined in single paper. If a candidate who has failed to secure the minimum pass mark of 50% ether in Section A or B, the candidate has to write again both the Sections irrespective the fact whether the candidate has passed in one Section.

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23. CARRY OVER OF FAILED SUBJECTS:

- A candidate has to pass in theory and practical examinations separately in each of the paper.
- If a candidate fails in either theory or practical examinations, he/she has to reappear for both (theory and practical).
- Only five attempts are allowed in each subject including 1st attempt.
- A candidate failing in more than 3 subjects will not be promoted to next year.
- Candidate are permitted to carry over any THREE failed subjects to the 2nd and 3rd year.
- The candidates who has failed MORE THAN THREE subjects shall not be permitted to undergo study and training of the next year.
- The failed candidates in more than THREE subjects can appear for the ensuing examinations in subsequent February/August.
- The candidate shall not be permitted into FINAL year unless she/he has
 passed all the subjects of the I,II &III year. No arrear can be carried over to
 FINAL year.

24. PRACTICAL EXAMINATION

Maximum number of candidates for practical examination should not exceed 20 per day.

The examiner should be a Lecturer or above in a college of Nursing with M.Sc. (N) in the concerned subject and minimum of 5 years of teaching experience.

Faculty with M.Sc.(N) qualification and required teaching experience in any Speciality shall be considered for conducting Practical Examination in the subject "Nursing Foundation".

25. EXAMINERS:

One internal and one external examiner should jointly conduct practical/oral examination for each student.

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26. REVALUATION / RETOTALLING OF ANSWER PAPERS:

Revaluation of answer papers is not permitted. Only re-totaling of theory answer papers is allowed in the failed subjects and should be applied through the institution.

27. AWARD OF MEDALS AND PRIZES:

The University shall award at its Convocation Medals and Prizes to outstanding candidates as and when instituted by the donors as per the prescribed terms and condition for the award of the same.

28. <u>AUTHORITY TO ISSUE TRANSCRIPT OF MARKS:</u>

The University shall be the Authority for issuing Transcript after remitting the prescribed fee.
