Maruthi Medical Centre and Hospital is a reputable and well-known medical facility. There are 300 beds in it.

- Emergency Department: Fully furnished to manage medical crises around-the-clock.
- Inpatient Services: Including private rooms, semi-private rooms, and general wards.
- Operating Theatres: Used for a variety of speciality surgical procedures.
- Diagnostic Services: These include pathology, imaging (MRI, CT scan, X-ray), and laboratory services.
