• Mid -level health providers (MLPs) are health workers trained at a higher education institution for at least 2-3 years. They are authorized to work autonomously to diagnose, manage and treat illness, disease and impairments, as well as engage in preventive and promotive care.

DEFINITION

According to the World Health Organisation (WHO), a mid-level health provider (MLHP) or mid-level health worker (MLHW) is referred to as a health provider who has completed pre-service higher education (at least 2-3 years) and who is trained, authorised and regulated to work autonomously, and whose scope of practice
